

2023 Virginia Writers Club Scholarship Guide

In keeping with the Club's vision to foster the art, craft, business and advocacy of the literary arts, the Virginia Writers Club (VWC) will award at least one \$2000 college scholarship for 2023. Please read these carefully. Not all applications for scholarships are handled in the same way.

The Scholarship

Scholarships are to be used for college tuition and/or books, or university/college-level writing program expenses.

The Scholarship will be paid directly to the college in the awardee's name.

Eligibility

VWC Scholarship(s) are open to **Virginia residents** who have a GPA of 2.0 or better on a 4.0 scale and meet the following additional criteria:

- High School Scholarship - Applicant must currently be a high school or a home-schooled *senior* who will be enrolled at an accredited college or university during the next academic year and *studying a field related to writing* (English, journalism, creative writing, etc.)
- College Scholarship - Applicant must be a current college/university *freshman* who is *studying a writing-related major* (English, journalism, creative writing, etc.) College freshmen who are former VWC High School Scholarship awardees are also eligible.

The Essay (Essays not on the topic required will not be considered)

Students will write an essay on the topic, **“Tell about what first inspired you to study the field related to writing you have chosen.”**

- Students should focus on the person, book, incident, etc., that made you think you'd like to write in your chosen field, relating how that inspired you to study in your particular field.
- Essays must be original, unpublished work and written solely by the Applicant.
- Essays will be judged by the Chairperson of the VWC Scholarship Committee and a panel of qualified authors and VWC members appointed by the Chairperson.
- The VWC reserves the right to publish the submitted essays in its publications. Application for the scholarship constitutes the awardee's consent for the VWC to publish his/her essay, names, city and state of residence, high schools and colleges attended, and the amount of the scholarship without requiring further permission, consent, payment or other consideration, unless prohibited by law.

Format

- The essay must be written in English.
- The essay ***must be*** between ***850-1,000 words***. Please note the maximum.
- The essay must be double-spaced and in Times New Roman 12 - point type throughout, with one-inch margins. Leave a ragged right margin.
- Identifying information about the student must appear ***ONLY*** on the application form and not in the essay.
- The title of the essay should appear at the top of page one and on the left in the header on succeeding pages; all pages after the first should be numbered on the right in the footer.
- Essays should be submitted ***together*** with all other materials submitted by the student. All forms submitted by the student should be scanned into a computer or otherwise electronically created and ***emailed*** as a .pdf file or Word file (.docx). The completed application should be sent as one attachment. The inability of the Chairperson to open the files created in other formats will constitute disqualification of the application without notice to the Applicant. ***Hard copies of student applications will not be considered.*** All material should be sent to **paulHVwrt1@yahoo.com**.
- All recommendations should be sent directly from the person submitting the recommendation to by email to the email address above. At least one letter of recommendation should be sent by an educator who knows the Applicant but is not related to the Applicant. Recommendation letters ***should NOT*** be sent by the student. Letters of Recommendation sent by educators should be sent through the school's email server if at all possible.
- All transcripts must be unaltered and can be sent by email either by the student as a scanned document as discussed above or the school or college sending the transcripts. Transcripts **sent by the school** may be sent by regular mail to the street address below; however, scanned emailed documents are preferred! Transcripts that appear to be altered in any way will not be considered. "Updated" transcripts will not be considered.

Application Requirements

The High School Scholarship Application Packet **MUST** include the following. Items sent by someone other than the Applicant are indicated by an asterisk (*). ***Missing items will disqualify the application without further notice to the Applicant:***

- Completed Application Form (high school for current high school seniors, college for current college freshmen). This must include the **News Release Form**.
- A cover letter that should be no more than one page containing a brief outline of Applicant's education and writing goals and a statement why the Applicant should receive the award
- A cover sheet containing the Applicant's name, address, phone number(s) and email address. ***Email addresses for which paulHVwrt1@yahoo.com is blocked will disqualify the application.***
- One electronic copy of the essay saved as a word document (.docx) or .pdf. The Applicant's name should not appear anywhere on the essay's pages.
- *A copy of the Applicant's most recent transcripts (cumulative 2.0 or better GPA on a 4.0 scale is required). Please do not send additional "updated" transcripts in addition to earlier transcripts. The GPA is for qualification purposes only, not a "weeding out" procedure based on the highest GPA. The **APPLICANT** is allowed to send these by email only. The schools may send by regular mail, but a scanned document sent by email is preferred.
- *One or two letters of reference from someone other than a relative who knows the Applicant well enough to speak with confidence about his or her character, potential and abilities as a writer.(i.e., a teacher, school counselor, or coach). These **must** be sent by the author of the letter.
- High school students may include a sample of their creative writing (fiction, poetry, etc.) **if they wish. If included, this must be no more than 300 words and need not be a complete composition.**

The College Freshmen Scholarship Application Packet must include all of the above PLUS the following:

- One scanned or otherwise electronically created copy of a sample of the Applicant's written work created during the previous academic year. These should be saved as a word document (.docx) or .pdf. The written work may be a short story, novel chapter, newspaper or magazine article, play or screenplay, or a collection of three to five poems. Hard copies are not be accepted.

Submission Method

- All materials sent by the student must be emailed to paulHVwrt1@yahoo.com. All essays must be in Times New Roman 12-point font. *Handwritten essay submissions* that are scanned and sent will be *automatically disqualified*. Fill-in-the-blank forms submitted may be filled in by hand and scanned, but if illegible, they will be disqualified.
- Letters of recommendation must be submitted as described above. **Only completed applications will be considered!**
- Simply stated, if the Applicant sends something, it should be sent by email as an attachment.

Timeline

The deadline for applications is June 30, 2023. All applications must be received by email before midnight at the end of June 30, 2023.

Delivery:

Letters of recommendation should be emailed to the above email address.

Transcripts should be sent by email or regular mail to Paul Steinberg, VWC Scholarship Chairperson, 11194 Manor View Drive, Mechanicsville, VA 23116. *Email is preferred though not mandatory*. Students should NOT send anything as part of the application by regular mail. All correspondence between the Applicant and the Chairperson of the Committee should occur through email only.

Scholarship Awards:

The winner will be notified by August 15, 2023. All decisions of the committee are final. The VWC Public Relations Officer will prepare and distribute the appropriate release(s) for media use. Those not winning the scholarship will not be notified.

On subsequent pages of this document, you will find the **Application Forms** for both high school and college students and the **News Release Form** as well as a **Checklist** for submissions. Students graduating from high school in 2023 should use the high school application. Students who are finishing their first year of college should use the college application. **College students who have advanced beyond their freshman year of college are not eligible**. These forms should be filled out, scanned or otherwise created as an electronic document, and emailed with all of the student's required

materials **at the same time**. Anything missing from the original submission will not be considered and will result in the disqualification of the application.

PLEASE NOTE AGAIN THAT FAILURE TO FOLLOW THESE GUIDELINES, AS WELL AS FAILURE TO SUBMIT ALL REQUIRED MATERIALS AT THE SAME TIME, WILL RESULT IN THE APPLICATION'S WITHDRAWAL FROM SCHOLARSHIP CONSIDERATION!
